## P.E. \& P.E. Substitutions

- High School students are required to take one year of a physical activity/education credit anytime during high school. This includes:
$\diamond$ Physical Education: Lifetime Recreation, Skill Based, \& Lifetime Fitness
$\diamond$ Athletics: any sport offered at Jordan High School
- Physical Activity/Education Substitutes include:
$\diamond$ Fall semester of Marching Band
$\diamond 1^{\text {st }}$ year of any Dance course: Dance I, Team, or Training
$\diamond$ Fall semester of Color Guard
$\diamond 1^{\text {st }}$ year of Cheerleading
$\diamond$ JROTC I (only at MCHS)
$\diamond$ Off-Campus PE - requires application \& campus approval


## Health \& Speech Requirements

Students are required to take a minimum of a semester of Health \& a semester of Speech/Communication credit. Students can take more credits if desired and can complete these courses at anytime during high school.
$\diamond$ Health courses offered at Jordan:
$\diamond$ Health Education (grades: 912) one semester course
$\diamond$ Principles of Health Science (grades 10-12) full year course but satisfies health course requirement. Intended for students pursuing the Health Science Pathway.
$\diamond$ Speech/Communication courses offered at Jordan:
$\diamond$ Leadworthy (grades 9-12) one semester course
$\diamond$ Debate I (grades 9-12) full year course
$\diamond$ AP Seminar (grades 10-12) full year course
$\diamond$ Dual Credit Speech (HCC) grades 10-12

## STUDY HALL

- NO credit
- Course number 0020
- Students should have earned HS credit in JH if selecting study hall as a course.



## ALTERNATE ELECTIVES

- Choose 3 alternate courses in case a course selected is unavailable. Counselors do their best to ensure students get into their first choice for electives, but course selection requests cannot be guaranteed due to class size limitations.
- Choose wisely as staffing is determined by the course selections.
- Students will be held responsible for their course selections.



## COURSE SEIECTION

- Students will receive a IHS Course Request Planning Worksheet and a Course Offerings for Current $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade Sheet.
- Students will complete a 4-year plan in SchooLinks. $8^{\text {th }}$ grade counselors will meet with students individually and approve the 4 -year plan.
- Students will complete the HHS Course Request Planning Worksheet with their $9^{\text {th }}$ grade courses ONLY.
- The Course Request Worksheet must be completed and returned by the campus due date.
- The Course Catalog is available online via SchooLinks.
- It is recommended that course selections are completed in pencil, so changes can be made neatly.


## COURSE VERIFICATION



Schoolinks

- Students will verify their course selections and endorsement in late March (3/21-3/27) through SchooLinks. A Google Form with instructions will be emailed out to parents and students.
- Review all requests and the endorsement for accuracy.

- Make any changes through the Google Form.
- List alternate choices in the order of preference.
- Course request verification does not guarantee that a student will get their first-choice electives or courses.


## COURSE VERIFICATIONS \& SCHEDULE CHANGES

- Course availability is determined by students' course selections.
- Course verification is the time to make changes to the course requests.
- Following the course verification window, schedule changes for the 2022-2023 school year will be allowed only in the following cases:

1. Error in scheduling by the school (data entry error);
2. Student has not met course prerequisites;
3. Student has already earned credit for the course;
4. Change in program (athletics, fine arts, etc.);
5. Level changes as recommended by the teacher and counselor, with parent and principal approval;
6. Student did not meet standard on STAAR/EOC exam.
*Please make selections carefully.*
NO elective changes will be honored after the course verification Google Form has closed. Schedule changes will not be honored throughout the school year, so choose your courses carefully.

## SEMESTER GRADES

- Grades always count.
- All daily grades, quizzes, and test grades will be recorded in the gradebook.
- The three 6 -weeks grades count for $85 \%$ of the semester average.
- The final exam grade counts as $15 \%$ of the semester average.
- The semester averages are recorded on the transcript.
- GPA is calculated using semester averages.
- Credits are earned at semester.

DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT (DLA)

The Distinguished Level of Achievement
(DLA) is earned through successful completion of:

All requirements for the Foundation High School Program, plus

The requirements of at least one endorsement, including

Algebra II among the four required math credits, and

A fourth science credit

A student must graduate with a Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA)
to be considered for the Top 10\% and eligibility for automatic admission to a Texas
public college or university.

## ALGEBRA II NOTICE



Algebra II is not specified as a graduation requirement;however, students who do not earn Algebra II credit are not eligible for:

- Earning the Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLAA), which requires completion of an endorsement with Algebra II among the four math credits,
- Recognition as an honors or high honors graduate,
- Automatic admission to a state public college or university, and
- Certain financial aid opportunities, including the TEXAS grant or the Texas Educational Opportunity Grant.


## TOP 10\% RUKE

A student whose class rank* is in the top 10 percent of the graduating class may be eligible for automatic admission consideration at a Texas public college or university.

Requirements to qualify for automatic admission consideration:

- Complete the FHSP + Endorsement, including the Distinguished Level of Achievement,
- Earn a satisfactory ACT or SAT score,
- Submit the application before the college or university's deadline, and
- Provide a final high school transcript verifying completion of the FHSP + Endorsement, including the Distinguished Level of Achievement.
*Class rank must be based on the student's rank at the end of the $11^{\text {th }}$ grade, middle of $12^{\text {th }}$ grade, or at high school graduation, whichever is most recent at the college or university's application deadline.*

- Students beyond the top $10 \%$ will be provided their quartile rank in the spring semester of their junior year.
