



 - also offered in summer school through Katy Virtual School
- AP Human Geography and AP Human Geography GT
 - not available to incoming 9th graders in summer school

If Academic or KAP World Geo is taken in the summer, there will be no social studies course to take during the 9th grade school year. Elective choices are more limited for 9th graders due to prerequisites and grade level restrictions, so a study hall may be the only option for your student.

Health & Speech Requirements


Students are required to take a minimum of a semester of Health & a semester of Speech/Communication credit. Students can take more credits if desired and can complete these courses at anytime during high school.

- Health courses offered at Jordan:
 - Health Education (grades: 9-12) one semester course
 - Principles of Health Science (grades 10-12) full year course but satisfies health course requirement. Intended for students pursuing the Health Science Pathway.

- Speech/Communication courses offered at Jordan:
 - Leadworthy (grades 9-12) one semester course
 - Debate I (grades 9-12) full year course
 - AP Seminar (grades 10-12)full year course
 - Dual Credit Speech (HCC) grades 10-12

STUDY HALL

- NO credit
- Course number 0020
- Students should have earned HS credit in JH if selecting study hall as a course.



ALTERNATE ELECTIVES

- Choose <u>3 alternate courses</u> in case a course selected is unavailable. Counselors do their best to ensure students get into their first choice for electives, but course selection requests cannot be guaranteed due to class size limitations.
- <u>Choose wisely</u> as staffing is determined by the course selections.
- Students will be held responsible for their course selections.


COURSE SELECTION

- Students will receive a <u>JHS Course Request Planning Worksheet</u> and a <u>Course Offerings for Current 8th Grade Sheet</u>.
- Students will complete a 4-year plan in SchooLinks. 8th grade counselors will meet with students individually and approve the 4-year plan.
- Students will complete the **JHS Course Request Planning Worksheet** with their 9th grade courses ONLY.
- The Course Request Worksheet must be completed and returned by the campus due date.
- The Course Catalog is available online via SchooLinks.
- It is recommended that course selections are completed in pencil, so changes can be made neatly.





- Students will verify their course selections and endorsement in late March (3/21-3/27) through SchooLinks. A Google Form with instructions will be emailed out to parents and students.
- Review all requests and the endorsement for accuracy.
- Make any changes through the Google Form.
- List alternate choices in the order of preference.
- Course request verification does not guarantee that a student will get their first-choice electives or courses.



Course availability is determined by students' course selections.

COURSE VERIFICATIONS & SCHEDULE CHANGES

- Course availability is determined by students' course selections.
- Course verification is the time to make changes to the course requests.
- Following the course verification window, schedule changes for the 2022-2023 school year will be allowed only in the following cases:




- 1. Error in scheduling by the school (data entry error);
- 2. Student has not met course prerequisites;
- 3. Student has already earned credit for the course;
- 4. Change in program (athletics, fine arts, etc.);
- 5. Level changes as recommended by the teacher and counselor, with parent and principal approval;
- 6. Student did not meet standard on STAAR/EOC exam.

Please make selections carefully.

NO elective changes will be honored after the course verification Google Form has closed. Schedule changes will not be honored throughout the school year, so choose your courses carefully.




Jordan High School Course Selection Step-by-Step



- View the <u>Course Selection Presentation Video</u>.

- Refer to the Course Catalog in Schoolinks for class descriptions-Course Catalog.
- Refer to Current 8th Grade Course Offerings Worksheet for classes offered at Jordan High School.
- 5. Complete the JHS Course Request Planning Worksheet (neatly with pencil)
- Enter your course selections from your worksheet in Course Planner found in Schoolinks between January 28th and February 6th.

SEMESTER GRADES

- Grades always count.
- All daily grades, quizzes, and test grades will be recorded in the gradebook.
- The three 6-weeks grades count for 85% of the semester average.
- The final exam grade counts as 15% of the semester average.
- The semester averages are recorded on the transcript.
- GPA is calculated using semester averages.
- Credits are earned at semester.

DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT (DLA)

The Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) is earned through successful completion of:

· All requirements for the Foundation High School Program, *plus*

• The requirements of <u>at least one</u> endorsement, including

Algebra II among the four required math credits, <u>and</u>

· A fourth science credit

A student must graduate with a Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) to be considered for the Top 10% and eligibility for automatic admission to a Texas public college or university.

ALGEBRA II NOTICE



Algebra II is not specified as a graduation requirement; however, students who do not earn Algebra II credit are not eligible for:

- Earning the Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA), which requires completion of an endorsement with Algebra II among the four math credits,
- Recognition as an honors or high honors graduate,
- Automatic admission to a state public college or university, and
- Certain financial aid opportunities, including the TEXAS grant or the Texas Educational Opportunity Grant.

Senate Bill 232



TOP 10% RULE

A student whose class rank* is in the top 10 percent of the graduating class may be eligible for automatic admission consideration at a Texas public college or university.

Requirements to qualify for automatic admission consideration:

- Complete the FHSP + Endorsement, including the Distinguished Level of Achievement,
- Earn a satisfactory ACT or SAT score,
- Submit the application before the college or university's deadline, and
- Provide a final high school transcript verifying completion of the FHSP
 + Endorsement, including the Distinguished Level of Achievement.

Class rank must be based on the student's rank at the end of the 11^{th} grade, middle of 12^{th} grade, or at high school graduation, whichever is most recent at the college or university's application deadline.

- The alphabetic identification for scores 70-79 is a C.
- Students in the top 10% will be provided their numeric class rank in the spring semester of their junior year.
- Transcripts will include the numeric class rank only for students in the top 10%.
- Students beyond the top 10% will be provided their **quartile rank** in the spring semester of their junior year.
