



#### **Graduation Requirements**

Beginning with the Freshman class of 2011-2012, a student must earn passing scores on 5 End-of-Course (EOC) exams, in addition to earning all required course credits for their graduation plan, to earn a diploma. Students must meet all graduation course credit requirements and EOC requirements to be eligible for participation in the graduation ceremony.

\*Requirements of the Foundation High School Program (FHSP) apply to students first entering 9th grade in the fall of 2014 and thereafter.

# **GRADING SCALE**

- The alphabetic identification for scores 70–79 is a C.
- Students in the top 10% will be provided their numeric class rank in the spring semester of their junior year.
- Transcripts will include the numeric class rank only for students in the top 10%.
- Students beyond the top 10% will be provided their quartile rank in the spring semester of their junior year.

#### DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT (DLA)

The Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) is earned through successful completion of:

- All requirements for the Foundation High School Program, <u>plus</u>
- The requirements of *at least one* endorsement, including
  - Algebra II among the four required math credits, *and*
  - A fourth science credit

A student must graduate with a Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA) to be considered for the Top 10% and eligibility for automatic admission to a Texas public college or university.





Algebra II is not specified as a graduation requirement; however, students who do not earn Algebra II credit are not eligible for:

- Earning the Distinguished Level of Achievement (DLA), which requires completion of an endorsement with Algebra II among the four math credits,
- Recognition as an honors or high honors graduate,
- Automatic admission to a state public college or university, and
- Certain financial aid opportunities, including the TEXAS grant or the Texas Educational Opportunity Grant.

# **TOP 10% RULE**

A student whose class rank\* is in the top 10 percent of the graduating class may be eligible for automatic admission consideration at a Texas public college or university.

\*Class rank must be based on the student's rank at the end of the  $11^{th}$  grade, middle of  $12^{th}$  grade, or at high school graduation, whichever is most recent at the college or university's application deadline.

A student in the Top 10% of the graduating class is eligible for automatic admission consideration at Texas public colleges and universities, with the exception of the University of Texas at Austin which is Top 6% of their class (for the Class of 2021 & 2022).



#### **TOP 10% RULE**

Requirements to qualify for automatic admission consideration:

- Complete the FHSP + Endorsement, including the Distinguished Level of Achievement,
- Earn a satisfactory ACT or SAT score,
- Submit the application before the college or university's deadline, and
- Provide a final high school transcript verifying completion of the FHSP + Endorsement, including the Distinguished Level of Achievement.

# CHOOSING COURSES FOR NEXT YEAR

- Students will select their courses for the 2022-23 school year online in SchooLinks which can be found in your MyKaty Cloud between January 28<sup>th</sup>-February 6<sup>th</sup>
- Choose courses from the 4 required subject areas: English/Math/Science/Social Studies
- Choose 3 elective courses to fill all <u>7</u> class periods
- If one course marked (sem) is selected, a second course marked (sem) is also required. Note— "sem" means that is a semester only course
- The student will meet to review credits and finalize course requests with their 8th grade counselor in February 2022.



# CHOOSING COURSES: P.E. & FINE ARTS

- Student-athletes must choose only <u>one</u> athletics program during online course selection. For multi-sport athletes, you will select the sport that comes first in the school year, and then coaches and counselors will work together to move students to their 2nd sport once the 1st sport season is over.
- Students can enroll in both a Fine Arts course and a PE/Athletics course during the same year.
- Band/Color Guard/Dance do have a PE credit option (talk to your director and/or counselor to make sure course code is correct!)





# **COURSE VERIFICATION**

- Course verification is the ONLY time to make changes to the course requests.
- Review all requests and the endorsement for accuracy and make any changes as needed.
- List alternate choices in the order of preference because elective classes are not guaranteed.
- Course Verification will take place between March 21st-March 27th.



#### KATY ISD SCHEDULE CHANGE POLICY

Once course verification has been completed, schedule changes for the 2022-23 school year will be allowed only in the following cases:

- 1. Error in scheduling by the school (data entry error)
- 2. Student has not met course prerequisites
- 3. Student has already earned credit for the course
- 4. Change in program (athletics, fine arts, etc.)
- 5. Level changes as recommended by the teacher and counselor, with parent and principal approval
- 6. Student did not meet standard on STAAR/EOC exam
